1. Background of the Mulyavardhan Programme

With a strong sense of social and educational commitment, the Shantilal Muttha Foundation (SMF) conceptualized and designed a Value Education Programme, known as 'Mulyavardhan' to reach to school children through their teachers and cluster heads who would adopt a learner centered approach, based on constructivism. The Government of Maharashtra signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with SMF on November 16, 2015 pledging to implement Mulyavardhan activities in the schools from 34 out of 36 districts of the State, except the two districts of Mumbai. Following several rounds of meetings and workshops with SMF, the Maharashtra State Council of Educational Research and Training (MSCERT – Vidyaparishad) accorded approval to the framework and activities of Mulyavardhan that formed the basis for the teacher workshop plan and development of workshop materials. One cluster that expressed keen interest to participate in Mulyavardhan programme from each of 34 districts across Maharashtra state was selected for implementation of pilot programme. Master trainers were selected amongst the Cluster Heads and two teachers from each selected cluster.

Later, a four day residential workshop for selected master trainers was held in three batches between December 28, 2015 and January 23, 2016 at the Wagholi Educational Rehabilitation Centre (WERC), Pune. This workshop aimed to orient selected master trainers so as to enable them to implement Mulyavardhan in their schools for three months before taking it to all teachers in the clusters. Master trainers also accepted this challenge confidently. Support received from Shri. Govind Nandede, Director of MSCERT and his colleagues Ms. Archana Kulkarni and Ms. Sangita Ghodekar in organising these workshops was highly motivating. Other experts from MSCERT also extended valuable cooperation and guidance in successful initiation of Mulyavardhan programme. Shri .Purushottam Bhapkar, Commissioner (Education) of Maharashtra and Shri. Mahavir Mane, Director of Primary Education contributed to the success of this programme with their hearty support.

2. Background of Observation Tour

It was anticipated that implementation of Mulyavardhan would start in the schools within two to three weeks after the first training workshop, ended on December 31, 2015. But it was pleasure to know that the master trainers (teachers) began to implement Mulyavardhan in their respective schools immediately after returning from the training workshop. SMF has appointed 20 coordinators covering all districts to coordinate with the cluster officers & teachers and support them in resolving difficulties in Mulyavardhan programme implementation. They also function as a link between the teachers and the Foundation.

Teachers are extremely enthused and have quickly started sharing their experiences, videos & photographs of activities, every day with District Coordinators, Cluster Heads and expert team at SMF through a WhatsApp group that was formed.

After a month of implementation, SMF and MSCERT planned school visits to get firsthand experience of the implementation. The plan was prepared in consultation with Cluster Heads, Headmasters and District Coordinators.

3. Objectives of the visit

The Observation visit was organized with the following objectives:

- To conduct classroom observations in at least two Mulyavardhan classes in project Schools across 34 Districts
- · To discuss concerns, if any, with teachers, headmasters and cluster heads
- To interact with the students
- To understand reactions of the members of SMCs and local leaders wherever possible

It was also intended to get feedback from cluster heads and teachers on the coordination work of District Coordinators during this visit. The main objective behind this was to avoid undue interference of District Coordinators in the classroom activities and improve the coordination mechanism.

Teams of officers and experts from SMF visited all schools according to the plan given in the following table:

4. Key observation of the visit

4.1 Teachers, Headmasters and Cluster Coordinators

A four-day workshop involving ZP teachers and cluster heads helped to orient participants to Mulyavardhan conceptual framework and activities with child-centered constructivist approach through hands-on experience. Materials developed by SMF including Teachers' Handbooks and Students' workbooks and other training materials, that are reviewed and approved by MSCERT, were brought into use during this training programme.

High enthusiasm and positive response of the teachers and cluster heads in implementing Mulyavardhan at the school level was observed during these school visits, which was beyond our expectations. We are also happy to note that SMC or local leaders were also observed to be positive towards Mulyavardhan implementation in the schools. Some key findings of the visit are as follows:

Kolhapur The cluster head has taken initiative to implement Mulyavardhan

> Programme in all schools across the cluster instead of only one school for first three months. Teachers have initiated the process

of recording their experiences on activities on their own.

In this district also, Mulyavardhan is being initiated in several Sangli

schools of the same cluster. Mulyavardhan is being implemented in two teacher schools in a satisfactory manner. These teachers

have planned their administrative as well as regular class work in such a way that the Mulyavardhan classes are being conducted according to the schedule within multi-grade situations.

Ahamadnagar, Gondia, Yavatmal and Pune

It is commendable to observe that teachers of Std. V to VII, attended Mulyavardhan workshop, are conducting activities for Std. I to III in addition to their regular V and VII class work. In Ahamadnagar district, Mulyavardhan activities are being introduced to V, VI and VII class students although currently MV is planned only for primary (from Class I to IV).

Palghar and Thane

Mulyavardhan teachers and cluster heads are very positive and enthusiastic. They organised a meeting with teachers and headmasters of all other schools in the cluster within a very short time. SMF experts oriented these teachers and headmasters on Mulyavardhan.

Osmanabad and Nagpur

HeadHeads of all the schools in the cluster were acquainted with the Mulyavardhan programme and all the headmasters expressed their willingness to implement Mulyavardhan in their respective schools.

Osmanabad

Teachers from this district expressed that Mulyavardhan workshop has contributed to their self development and thought that this will contribute to the self development of other teachers too.

Gadchiroli

All the schools in this district are in remote pockets but they are willing to take up the Mulyavardhan programme.

Aurangabad

Showing good sense of understanding of the Mulyavardhan activities, the teachers and cluster heads have prepared a systematic timetable and have started maintaining records. Their understanding on Mulyavardhan is found to be fairly good.

Jalna

Efforts are being made by teachers to take Mulyavardhan forward with the help of street plays and special programmes for parents.

Parbhani and Solapur

Teachers, cluster heads, members of the SMCs and villagers have shown high enthusiasm. They have joined hands with school authorities to implement Mulyavardhan effectively in the schools.

Amravati

Dhulia, Nandurbar and Though the teachers were trained on MV through using Marathi medium, but they are making efforts to use local Adivasi dialect to conduct Mulyavardhan activities in the schools to overcome bilingual challenges.

It was observed that teachers and cluster heads are making all efforts to implement Mulyavardhan programme effectively with

great spirit.

5. Initiatives of Katol and Narkhed Blocks from Nagpur District

MSCERT has taken a decision to launch Mulyavardhan activities in all ZP Schools at the insistence of the local leaders of Katol and Narkhed Blocks. Teachers from Katol conducted Mulyavardhan activities with Std. II students in the presence of parents during the SMF visit to the schools. Parents expressed their satisfaction when the students told twenty good habits during Mulyavardhan session. Students share Mulyavardhan thoughts during school assembly. We feel confident that implementation of Mulyavardhan in all project schools across the state will be successful with the joint efforts of local leaders, Zilla Parishad, MSCERT and SMF.

6. Sharing through WhatsApp

WhatsApp group has been formed with teachers, cluster heads from project areas of all the districts. Senior officers of the MSCERT that are coordinating Mulyavardhan programme, are also members of the group. SMF head office is able to receive daily updates and school-level happenings through WhatsApp. Wardha, Nasik, Osmanabad, Thane, Nagpur, Nanded, Solapur, Buldhana, Palghar, Amravati, Dhulia and Yavatmal are some districts which are prominently using WhatsApp for sharing their experiences, updates, videos and photos of MV Activities. This also enables teachers, CRCs and DCs to express their feelings and interact with each other. Teachers from Solapur prepared a guideline for WhatsApp indicating what should and what should not be included in the posts on WhatsApp. Teachers have also gone a step further to suggest remedies to their issues and challenges. Teachers are happy to receive regular responses from the SMF Head Office. In future, this social medium will be used for programme improvement, offering suggestions, innovations and contextualization.

7. Identified areas for improvement

Based on the observations made during the school visits, the following areas require more emphasis in the future Mulyavardhan workshops. This will enable teachers and cluster heads in gaining skills in these areas and make Mulyavardhan Programme more effective.

- 1. To introduce each activity more effectively to children
- 2. To make appropriate use of cooperative learning methods
- 3. To provide more time for learners' talk
- 4. To provoke thinking among the learners through effective use of open-ended questions
- 5. To inculcate the art of discussing different topics among the learners
- 6. To initiate the topic in a natural way and through conversation
- 7. To develop an activity in an interesting manner
- 8. To develop methods for conducting Mulyavardhan activities in multi-grade situations
- 9. To make story telling effective
- 10. To pay due attention to every child in the classroom
- 11. To adopt methods of positive discipline
- 12. To avoid instructional tone in classroom interaction
- 13. To develop new activities and materials
- 14. To contextualize the Mulyavardhan content with local situations and subject contents

8. Role of the District Coordinators

SMF appointed 20 district coordinators that include retired ZP teachers & cluster heads and energetic youth with experience in the field of education, covering all project districts with a responsibility to extend all possible cooperation and support to the teachers and cluster heads for effective implementation of Mulyavardhan programme. They were restricted from carrying out classroom observations and were asked not to meddle with the classroom instruction process in any way. Some instances of coordinators violating these instructions have come to notice. SMF, in consultation with MSCERT, is initiating measures to overcome

these issues. Despite this, the scenario of Mulyavardhan Programme in schools is very impressive. Teachers, and cluster heads are working well without any conflict with the members of SMCs and headmasters.

9. Action Points for SMF

- 1. To prepare an action plan to carry out improvements as per suggestions emerging from the visit.
- 2. To make a list of enthusiastic teachers and cluster heads who can work as resource persons and discuss it with the MSCERT.
- 3. To make WhatsApp group more effective and use it to take cognizance of school-level activities and to use this medium to offer prompt suggestions when necessary.
- 4. To extend technical support to the teachers and cluster heads at the school level from the SMF Head Office through District Coordinators.
- 5. To extend support to teacher as required through expert visits.
- 6. To document and share success stories of different teachers through social media and websites for public awareness.
- 7. To recognize and appreciate teachers who are doing commendable work and share their work in the form of videos and photographs through WhatsApp.
- 8. To develop a policy at the SMF to help teachers to make effective use of WhatsApp, Twitter, Face Book and the Internet.
- 9. To adopt a system of providing weekly feedback to the teachers in order to ensure continuous support in the process of their skill development.
- 10. To develop and provide audio-visual materials to enable the teachers to grasp various concepts in a better manner.
- 11. To prepare an action plan to launch Mulyavardhan in all schools in Katol and Narkhed Blocks of Nagpur district.
- 12. To prepare a plan jointly with MSCERT to train the teachers and cluster heads to work as resource persons. These teachers and cluster heads have already been trained earlier to carry out Mulyavardhan in their schools

10. Points required MSCERT attention

- To compile and share experiences of teachers who have implemented Mulyavardhan activities in their schools in the last three months. Organise an experience sharing meeting with all these teachers and cluster heads in April.
- 2. To organize a workshop at Pune for these teachers and cluster heads
- To upload details of Mulyavardhan as programme of Government of Maharashtra on the SCERT website so as to make it available to the people in the state in order to take the programme forward.
- 4. To shortlist and upload the videos received through WhatsApp on the SCERT Website to share the excellent work done by the teachers with other teachers and stakeholders.
- 5. To publish information of Mulyavardhan programme through SCERT on behalf of the Government of Maharashtra.
- To impart training to the teachers of Std. I to IV from the schools where teachers of Std. V to VII were trained, instead of teachers at primary level.

- 7. To arrange training for ZP teachers and cluster heads from some districts who are willing voluntarily to implement Mulyavardhan programme in their schools
- 8. To consider the possibility of developing a programme with a whole-school approach with the help of the headmasters who have initiated Mulyavardhan activities through school assembly, skits, parents' awareness programme, etc.
- 9. To prepare an action plan for launching Mulyavardhan programme in all schools of Katol and Narkhed in Nagpur District.
- 10. To finalise a plan and schedule for another round of workshop for Master trainers and cluster heads to resolve issues and challenges faced during last three months, and equip them to conduct training for all other teachers from their clusters.

11. Views of Shantilal Muttha on this Report

Although process of developing a conceptual framework of Mulyavardhan has been carried out for the last six years by SMF, the doors of schools were opened for Mulyavardhan as soon as the Government of Maharashtra signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with SMF. I acknowledge the step of Government of Maharashtra with a deep sense of gratitude.

It was initially intended to implement this programme in one school in a cluster of each of the 34 districts for the first three months during 2015-16 academic year and extend it to all schools in project clusters of these districts from the beginning of academic year 2016-17. Within first three months of implementation during 2015-16 academic year, the programme has shown its potential of becoming successful in all schools in the State. Cooperation from MSCERT and all efforts of the teachers and cluster heads, learners' enthusiasm and participation of parents and members of the SMCs indicated the social and educational acknowledgement to this programme.

It is still a long way to go. I would like to mention that although the public perception of ZP teachers is unflattering, I have a great regard for them and I am sure that these teachers are very capable of taking Mulyavardhan programme effectively to young learners. I promise cooperation of SMF to all the ZP teachers and cluster heads in their endeavor. We are determined to take this work to all schools in Maharashtra. This is a Government of Maharashtra programme and SMF is extending cooperation to the government in its implementation.

12.Implementation of Mulyavardhan Programme : Positive takeaways

- 1. Programme is being implemented in 34 districts with great enthusiasm.
- 2. Teachers and cluster heads are fully involved in Mulyavardhan Programme.
- 3. There are demands to either launch or extend Mulyavardhan in the schools in entire Blocks from various districts in the state.
- 4. It is scheduled to launch Mulyavardhan in all schools of selected clusters from June 2016. But it is noticed in few districts that the teachers and cluster heads are implementing it right from January 2016.


- 5. ZP teachers have adapted to Mulyavardhan concepts & practices and appear to be adequately comfortable with it.
- 6. Learner participation in Mulyavardhan activities is found to be remarkable.
- 7. Teachers are developing understanding of constructivist approach while conducting Mulyavardhan activities.
- 8. Every teacher and cluster head has accepted this programme wholeheartedly and their commitment to this programme is clearly reflected during the field visits and in classrooms.
- 9. Block Education Officers, members of the SMCs and villagers are found equally enthusiastic about Mulyavardhan programme.
- 10. There is a mood of joyfulness in schools.
- 11. SMF had given Activity Book to a single school. But the teachers in one cluster took its photocopies to teach Mulyavardhan in the entire cluster.
- 12. On the basis of the success achieved by Mulyavardhan in a very short period of two months, we are confident that teachers, cluster heads and other education officials together, with support from SMF, can implement this programme successfully in all schools across Maharashtra.

13. Shikshanachi Vaari (Educational Fair)

A stall to exhibit Mulyavardhan programme and allied materials was setup in the exhibition "ShikshanachiVaari", an initiative of Government of Maharashtrato share innovations in the field of Education in the state. More than five hundred teachers and cluster heads have expressed their eagerness in written form to implement Mulyavardhan in their schools. It is remarkable that such a large number of teachers and cluster heads volunteered to implement Mulyavardhan in their schools.
