To read a lot is essential. It is stupid not to venture outside the examination 'set books' or the textbooks you have chosen for intensive study. We are what we eat. The type of food we eat has both immediate and long term effect on us, at all the three levels—the body, the mind and the spirit. A survey conducted by the Chilika wildlife division has revealed that the number of migratory birds arriving at the lake has increased to over two million. Many rare birds like the Smew Duck Mallard, Nakata, Marbled Teal and Goliath Heron have also been spotted last year.

Application of pesticides and chemicals in the fileds and loss of natural habitat affect bird migration. Birds and animals have a relationship and their harmonious presence is beneficial for the continuity of a sanctuary.






